Psalm 23 and Ephesians 3:14-21

I am a bit over hearing that we live in unprecedented times, and the only news is the Coronavirus and people defying the Governments pleas for social distancing! Are our freedoms being taken away from us? I would say no- yet some, for whatever reason believe that it is their right to put others in danger. The Government is urging isolation and distancing- this insidious disease is not a respecter of persons and will seek to thrive and live if people give it a chance. Distancing and isolation appear to be the best plan of attack. What is it with us human beings? We just do not want to be told. Perhaps this is why the Bible includes the phrase *'all we like sheep have gone astray'?* Sheep I am told are hard to lead, they are so easily distracted. Maybe, this is a cry for help- fear and loss cause each one of us to act and react in ways that we might not under normal circumstance.

This crisis has brought out the worst and the best in us- there are some tremendous stories of selfsacrifice and care. On the 27th March a man was so moved by the lines at a Centrelink branch that he withdrew \$10k out of his bank and handed everyone \$100. I am sure more good stories will emerge? *Fear and doubt is not a new phenomenon, many a Christian has experienced them. It is not a sin to fear or to doubt, or to experience anxiety, it becomes a sin when we <u>wallow</u> <i>in these emotions, or if they lead us to sin. When we act out of disbelief or fear we are prone to do dumb things. When in this state, it is best just to own it, tell God exactly what is going on and determine that despite feelings or emotions, to trust Him. Is it easy? I would be lying to you if I said that it was. What we must understand is that it is not the amount of faith that I have, or you have, but the object of our faith.*

I like the hymn, 'In Christ alone' written by Stuart Townend

In Christ alone my hope is found, He is my light, my strength, my song

This Cornerstone, this solid Ground, Firm through the fiercest drought and storm What heights of love, what depths of peace. When fears are stilled, when strivings cease. My Comforter, my All in All. Here in the love of Christ I stand.

The Lord Jesus knows who we are, He knows how we are feeling, and He can meet our needs. The Apostle Paul concluded a paragraph by saying this about the Lord Jesus. *Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us,* Ephesians 3:20.

Can it be trusted? We all face the struggle of *'the theory verses the fact'*. We need to turn good theory into life fact. Some say 'it can't be done!' I beg to differ. After much trial and error, the Wright Brothers were able to fly- even if it was for a short distance. So why not with good theology? History shows us that many have gone before us and have discovered the essentials of faith and a faith walk. This doesn't mean that we do not struggle with it- we all struggle with faith. Do we need to struggle with God? Now that is the key!

What do we understand about the nature of God? John 3:17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

God has a plan, one that involves the working out of His grace. Grace is something that we do not deserve- it is a gift. The very nature of our creation at the hands of God, makes us the perfect candidates for the Grace of God. God knows and understands our frailty better than we do. The Lord Jesus warns us about adversity and suffering in this life. Hear what the Apostle Peter says: **1 Peter:3** *Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 2 Peter 1:3 <i>His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.* The Grace of God works in our lives, it is God's gift- it begins with the offer of salvation and a gift for living and it takes us into an eternity with God the Father.
